

Figuring out who won the pumpkins turned out to be an awesome math lesson last Friday! We connected our week-long learning about number lines to the line plot created with all of our guesses. We also talked about the 'range' of guesses, as well as calculated who was the closest to the actual weights. For example, the medium pumpkin was 9 lbs. and 11 oz. To figure out if 9.5 or 9.15 was closer to 9.11, we used adding/subtraction and the number line gave a great visual. The kids really did an amazing job not only of guessing but also grappling with the math afterwards. Some were disappointed when they found out they didn't win, but everyone still celebrated the winners! Good job, Room 26!
