## **Assorted Spelling Activities**

## Change-A-Word

In this activity, it is best with 3-5 letter spelling words, a beginning word is chosen and players take turn changing one letter and making a new word. Players can change only 1 letter on their turn to make a new word. Take turns making as many words as you can. An adult can verify spelling. Periodically, use a dictionary to confirm spelling. It is great to do this occasionally to reinforce dictionary skills.
